

TIME AND ACCURACY MATCH  
(BARRICADE)  
November 19, 2005

In today's match each competitor will take a total of eight shots from three different positions to the left, center and right side of a barricade. The barricade is roughly eight feet long by two feet high. The targets will be placed at various distances across the range from 100 yards to 200 yards.

The match is open to rifles with either open or optical sights. Slings and mobile front rests are allowed. If a front rest is used it must either be attached to the rifle, such as a bipod, or something typically carried in the field, such as a backpack. If a front rest is used on any position it must be carried to all positions whether or not it is used it is used in all positions.

To assist the competitors the match time keeper will walk each competitor through the course while they shoot it.

Time begins with "TIME" command and ends with the last shot.

Rifles must be empty, magazines out and bolts open when moving between positions.

1. Competitors start standing at the center of the barricade. At the command "TIME" the competitor moves to the left side of the barricade, takes a prone position, loads a maximum of two rounds and takes one shot at each of the two **white** targets with the **rifle in the left shoulder**. The rifle may be rested against the side of the barricade. Immediately after the second shot the competitor moves to the right side of the barricade.
2. At the right side of the barricade the competitor takes a prone position and takes one shot at each of the three **orange** targets with the **rifle in the right shoulder**. The rifle may be rested against the side of the barricade. Immediately after the third shot the competitor moves to the center of the barricade.
3. At the center of the barricade the competitor takes one shot at each of the three **black** targets. The rifle may be rested on top of the barricade and shot from **either shoulder**. Time ends with the last shot.

**Scoring:**

The score is the time to make all eight shots plus one minute added for each missed target. A shot on a wrong target is scored as a miss.

Competitors may run the course as often as they want.

The class of rifle and sight, open or optical, used will be noted with the scores.

Note: For competitors with Garands, there are two and five round clips which may be borrowed for the match.
